04/2019 – 04/2022: Senior researcher at INRCA - National Institute of Health & Science on Ageing within the project: "National Strategy for Active Ageing Policies and Interventions in Italy", coordinated by INRCA and funded by the Department for Family Policies at the Presidency of the Council of Ministers, under the main framework of the Madrid International Plan of Action on Ageing - MIPAA. The project aims at overcoming the Italian regional fragmentation developing a national multilevel and co-participated approach on active ageing, through the involvement of both relevant stakeholders in all policy areas at different levels (national, regional, local) and beneficiaries and their communities following a multilevel governance approach.

My role in the project is that of **coordinating** the analysis of the state of the art in relation to policies on Active Ageing (AA) in all Italian regions, that represents the first milestone in the establishment of a national strategy for interventions on Active Ageing; I will therefore **support** the establishment of such strategy and (in liaison with Istat) the adaptation of the Active Ageing Index - developed in 2012 within the European Year of Active Ageing - to the regional contexts.

**06/2017 – 05/2018: Post-doctoral researcher** (SPS/09 – Sociology) at Università Politecnica delle Marche. Research title: “Health, demographic change and well-being”, scientific responsible Prof. Maria Giovanna Vicarelli. The research was funded by the UNIVPM strategic project “MIR-AGE Multidisciplinary Innovative Research Actions on AGE”. The goal of my research was related to the analysis of health and well-being in the framework of an increasing ageing population. In particular, I developed a database with a systematic multidisciplinary review of the key publications on the intersection between health and life events aimed at identifying the variables used to measure different aspects of health and wellbeing in later life. In addition, I coordinated a quantitative survey with older individuals on topics related to lifestyle, life events and health trajectories, in order to shed light on the multidimensional concept of health and wellbeing in later life. I am still collaborating in this (ongoing) project.

**2014 – 2017: Post-doctoral researcher (SECS-S/04 Demography)** at Università Politecnica delle Marche. Research title: “Ageing, Migration and Health in Multi-ethnic Societies”, within the EU project ‘Adrihealthmob - Adriatic Model of Sustainable Mobility in the Health and Care Sector’, funded by an EU grant under the Adriatic IPA Cross Border Cooperation Programme. My main **research duties** were: literature review on the consequences of migration on the ageing and multi-ethnic population, with a special focus on integration/exclusion, living arrangements, vulnerabilities, health, emerging needs and responses in terms of services, welfare and financial implications for the societies affected at both sides of migration and policy responses at a range of scales – local, national and European; I also analysed the role of ICT in supporting healthy ageing and social inclusion of vulnerable groups, and in preventing social isolation and health-risk behaviours. Moreover, I focused on the intersection of ageing and migration, and the wide taxonomy of migrant types, from the most well-off and active individuals to those who are deprived, marginalised and reliant on survival tactics. With the purpose of analysing how migration affects families and individuals well-being and vulnerabilities in later life and in different contexts, I developed a (ongoing) research project with Professor Russell King (Sussex University) and Professor Tineke Fokkema (NIDI -Netherlands Interdisciplinary Demographic Institute) on the topic “**International Retirement Migration and lifestyle mobility**”. This research is based on 120 in-depth interviews with IRMs of British, Dutch and German origin living (permanently or back and forth) in the Marche as well as natives and local stakeholders, and we are in the process of analysing the data also in an international comparative perspective.

relations, return intentions, transnationalism.

I carried out part of the quantitative survey in the Marche region and supervised the research team assistants who administered the questionnaires: a total of 500 interviews were collected in the Marche, Apulia and Veneto regions (in Italy) and 200 interviews in the Vlore region in Albania.

Moreover, I carried out in-depth interviews and coordinated roundtable discussions with key stakeholders such as policy makers, academics, local NGOs and migrants’ family members in Albania on the topic of the impact of migration on the local communities. Focus groups were organized also with migrants’ communities in Italy on the topic of associations’ involvement in the public arena in Italy and in transnational activities.

I was selected **as expert on migration and labour market** for the Independent Final Evaluation of the Programme “Youth Migration: Reaping the Benefits and Mitigating the Risks” (YEM Programme). I was part of an international two-member evaluation team (together with Christian Bugnion de Moreta). The YEM Programme was funded by the Government of Spain through the Millennium Development Goals Fund (MDGF), in support of the Government of Albania and was assigned to the Ministry of Labour, Social Affairs and Equal Opportunities. The Programme I evaluated consisted of several small-scale projects implemented by Ministry of Culture, Tourism, Youth, and Sport, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and four international organizations: ILO, IOM (International Organisation for Migration), UNDP (United Nations Development Programme), and UNICEF (United Nations Children's Fund).

The evaluation aimed at:

1. measuring to what extent the joint programme (so the above public and international actors) had fully implemented the activities, delivered outputs and attained outcomes and reached the development results.
2. generating substantive evidence-based knowledge, on one or more of the MDG-F thematic windows by identifying best practices and lessons learned useful to other development interventions at national (scale up) and international level (replicability).

Our evaluation used a mixed-method approach including both quantitative and qualitative data collection and elaborations. The qualitative analysis was based on semi-structured interviews and focus-group carried out in Albania during May 2012 with all Ministers involved, UN agencies in Albania, local stakeholders and representatives of the civil society.

## Fund raising and project management activities

I have accumulated an important track record of successful research projects as listed below:
