## CV SUMMARY

Daniela Bellani is a Senior post-doctoral researcher at the University of Florence, where she is a member of the ERC project EU-FER, *Economic Uncertainty and Fertility in Europe*. Her areas of interests are the cross-country and over-time variations in family and labour market institutions as well as the relationships between social stratification, preferences and demographic outcomes.

She obtained the PhD at the University of Milan, Graduate School of Social and Political Sciences - defence in 2010, declaration in 2011. Her thesis was titled "Sociological aspects of labour market flexibility and wage inequality: the Italian case" (written in English).

After the doctoral studies, Daniela Bellani has developed three lines of research.

A first line concerns the role played by economic institutions and by norms on social stratification in demographic behaviour - with a particular attention to the educational gradient of fertility and singlehood. Her research has also focused on the impact of the gender revolution and of changing labour markets on fertility, life-long singlehood and divorce dynamics in Western countries.

Another line of research that she has developed falls into the field of Economic Sociology. She has theorized and tested unexpected consequences (the so-called knock-on effects) of labour markets deregulation on workers' conditions in Europe.

More recently, she is analysing understudied determinants of family and labour market dynamics namely individual preferences, such as risk aversion and social preferences (trust).

She has also teaching experience. During the last years she has been lecturer for the following courses, "Market Research and Statistics", "Quantitative Methods for Social Research", "Women, Family and Labour market" (in Spanish/Catalan) at the undergraduate level as well as for the courses "Stata for Master Thesis" (in English) for Master students at the Universitat Pompeu Fabra, Barcelona.

She has been P.I. of the project funded by "Obra Social LaCaixa" (2015-2018) titled "Barometer of Social Indicators". This consisted in the elaboration of a Barometer of new social indicators about education and social exclusion.
