CV SUMMARY

Daniela Bellani is an Assistant Professor at the Scuola Normale Superiore, Department of Political and Social Sciences. Her areas of interests are the cross-country and over-time variations in labour market and family institutions as well as the relationships between social stratification and demographic outcomes.

She received the Ph.D at the University of Milan, Graduate School of Social and Political Sciences. Her thesis was titled “Sociological aspects of labour market flexibility and wage inequality: the Italian case.”

After the doctoral studies, Daniela Bellani has developed three lines of research. A first line concerns the role played by economic institutions and by norms on social stratification in demographic behaviour - with a particular attention to the educational gradient of fertility and singlehood. Working within the ERC project “Family Dynamics” at the University Pompeu Fabra, her research has also focused on the impact of the gender revolution and of changing labour markets on fertility, life-long singlehood and divorce dynamics In Western countries.

Another line of research, that she has developed within the ERC project “Economic Uncertainty and fertility” at the University of Florence, falls into the field of Economic Sociology. She has theorized and tested unexpected consequences of labour markets deregulation on permanent workers’ conditions in Europe.

More recently, joining the ERC project “Globalization and Technology-Driven Labour Market Change and Fertility” at the University of Warsaw, she is analysing understudied determinants of family and labour market dynamics, namely automation and robotization.

Her publications appear in international peer-reviewed journals such as *Socio-Economic Review*, *Journal of Marriage and Family*, *Research in Social Stratification and Mobility*, among others. She serves as a Reviewer of several international journals such as *American Sociological Review*, *European Sociological Review* and *Journal of Family Issues*.
