2020-2023: **PhD research project** on Social and Gender Inequalities in Western Europe: Examining How Women's Disadvantages are Shaped by the Interplay between Family Dynamics and Social Background of Origin. PhD program in Economic Sociology and Labour Studies, Department of social and political sciences, University of Milan.

The research is composed of three studies:

- The first study is focused on the analysis of educational inequalities in upper secondary school in Italy, influenced by the environment and the structure (sibling gender composition, their birth order) of the family of origin.
- The second study investigates the impact of interregional geographical mobility and family dynamics on women's employment outcomes in Europe, identifying patterns of (dis)advantages that accumulate over the life course.
- The third study is focused on the interplay between the family-of-origin (social class of origin) and family-of-destination (motherhood, partner's resources) factors in shaping women's employment outcomes in Europe.
